

## The Clergy of Christ Church

*Beginning in 1935, when Christ Church was a mission, the clergy who served the church did so on a part-time basis while serving the parishes noted in the list.*

- 1935 – 1937 John F. Haymaker, Priest-in-charge  
Rector: Wadesboro, Calvary Church
- 1937 – 1939 Frank Pulley, Priest in Charge  
Rector: Wadesboro, Calvary Church
- 1939 – 1941 William Penn Price, Priest-in-charge  
Rector: Asheboro, Church of the Good Shepherd
- 1941 – 1942 Franklyn Herman Board, Deacon <sup>1</sup>
- 1943 – 1945 Robert Hampton Price, Priest-in-charge <sup>2</sup>
- 1945 – 1948 Edwin F. Jeffress, Jr. , Priest-in-charge  
Rector: Concord, All Saints

*Since the arrival of The Rev. Hall Partrick in 1949, Christ Church has been served by full-time clergy.*

- 1949 – 1953 T. Hall Partrick, Priest-in-charge <sup>3</sup>
- 1953 – 1956 Bruce Daniel Sapp, Priest-in-charge
- 1957 – 1961 Eric D. Collie, Priest-in-charge

- 1991 – 1992 Joseph Allison Hayworth, Interim Rector
- 1992 – 1997 John Crawford Bauerschmidt, Rector <sup>5</sup>
- 1998 – 1999 Willard Seymour Taylor, Jr., Interim Rector
- 1999 – 2001 Alan Edgar Belton, Rector
- 2001 – 2003 Edward Chisolm Scott, Interim Rector
