FR. JIM’S JOURNAL: “Changes Coming!”

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

First of all, I wish to thank those of you who took the time to fill out the Holy Week 2011 survey. Please look this survey over, to see how your fellow parishioners feel about our Holy Week services. It seems to me that there were some strong feelings on both sides regarding the lack of an outside procession for the 10:30 service on Palm Sunday. This year, we decided to keep the “Liturgy of the Palms” inside the church, for the sake of those who cannot walk well. (In previous years, because of the “Liturgy of the Palms” taking place outside, those who cannot stand or walk well missed that part of the service.) IF we get a new speaker system in our church this coming year (with portable microphones), this may enable us to have the outdoor procession, yet include those who aren’t able to participate in the procession.

Strong feelings were also shared about the “washing of the feet” during the Maundy Thursday service. Practically everyone thought this was a meaningful part of the service.

Although many attended the Easter Vigil Eucharist on Easter Eve, some were upset because it started 20 minutes late. I apologize that the service didn't begin on time; however, next year, the service will start promptly, and will be shortened a bit.

Everyone did seem to enjoy the "breaking up" of the Scripture lessons with different readers, for a more dramatic effect. We will do this next Easter Eve, and perhaps some other times during the year.

Beginning the Sunday after Father's Day (June 26), all Sunday and Wednesday services will be held in the parish hall through September 4. This is because of some much-needed repair work that will be done to the church during the summer. Among the tasks to be done are the following:

- 1) repairing some cracks in the walls;
- 2) painting & sealing some walls & ceiling panels;
- 3) installing a new carpet for the aisle;
- 4) refurbishing the pews; and
- 5) caulking & refinishing the windows.

This much-needed project will take most of the summer, which causes us to have our Sunday & Wednesday services in the parish hall until the project is completed. Thank you for your patience & understanding!

ALTAR FLOWERS



We are in need of donors for *Altar Flowers* for the next few weeks. Flowers on the sconces behind the altar remind us of the presence of God in this place, and the sacredness of the Eucharist that is celebrated at the altar. Although altar flowers are offered to the Glory of God, they may also be offered in thanksgiving for someone or something (e.g., a birthday or anniversary), or in memory of a loved one who has passed away. Our church members and friends normally have the opportunity to offer altar flowers for most Sundays of the year, with some special exceptions. e.g., major feastdays like Pentecost, where our Flower Guild places special flowers. Also, we normally do not offer flowers during the Liturgical Seasons of Advent and Lent.

Flowers may be reserved by signing the Flower List on the church hall bulletin board, **and notifying our secretary, Michelle Coley**, about this. (Or you may call the church office during business hours to see if a certain date is available, and have Michelle put down your choice of date.) Once the church office is notified and your date is set, you may do one of three things:

- 1) Call a local florist like Harwood's in Albemarle, to prepare your flowers. (This may be expensive, depending on your choice of flowers!) Harwood's has a key to the church and can pick up the flower pot liners from the sacristy.
- 2) Call our Flower Guild Chair, Joe Burris, to see if he might be able to arrange altar flowers for the occasion. If Joe is free, he can do a wonderful arrangement for you at a less expensive price. Michelle at the church office can give you Joe's contact information when you reserve the date for your flowers.
- 3) Arrange for seasonal fresh-cut flowers (from your garden or otherwise) to be given. Again, you will need to contact Michelle at the church office and Joe Burris on this, so that we can arrange for a proper container for your flowers, and ensure that there are no ants or bugs in the flowers before we place them in the vases.

*Because of some needed repair work in the church proper, we will be having our Sunday and weekday services in the church hall during these Sundays. We can still accept a small vase of fresh-cut altar flowers for the altar in the parish hall during that time.

In the event that we do not have altar flowers for a given Sunday, the Altar and Flower Guilds will purchase some nice seasonal artificial flowers to adorn the altar.

SANCTUS LAMP

The *Sanctus Lamp* is the red-colored candle lamp on the left side of the sanctuary, near the tabernacle (box where reserved Holy Communion is kept for the sick and homebound parishioners). This lamp was originally lit from the fire that is blest on Easter Eve. Each candle in the lamp lasts for approximately 7 days. The Altar Guild lights the new week's candle from the flame of the candle of the previous week, so that the same flame that was blest on Easter Eve remains until the following Holy Week. The Sanctus lamp reminds us of Christ's presence in the reserved Sacrament of Holy Communion, and also reminds us of our prayers that are lifted up to God through Christ. Like Altar Flowers, the Sanctus Lamp is offered to the Glory of God, and may also be offered in thanksgiving for someone or something (e.g., a birthday or anniversary), or in memory of a loved one who has passed away. A Sanctus Lamp calendar is also on the bulletin board of the church hall; if you'd like to offer the lamp on one Sunday, please notify Michelle at the church office (704/ 982-1428). Although a \$5 donation is requested to cover the cost of the candle, there is no set fee for this offering. Offerings for the Sanctus Lamp are available for all Sundays (except the asterisked ones*, above) from now through the end of the year.

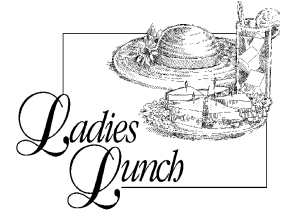

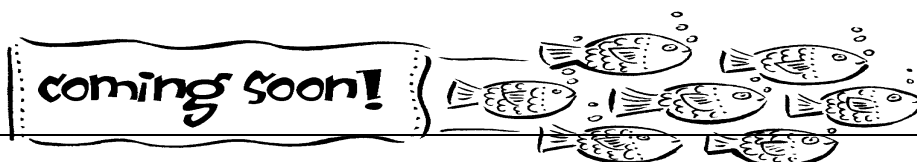

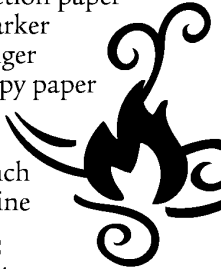
Kid's Page

PENTECOST MOBILE

Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line



What you do:

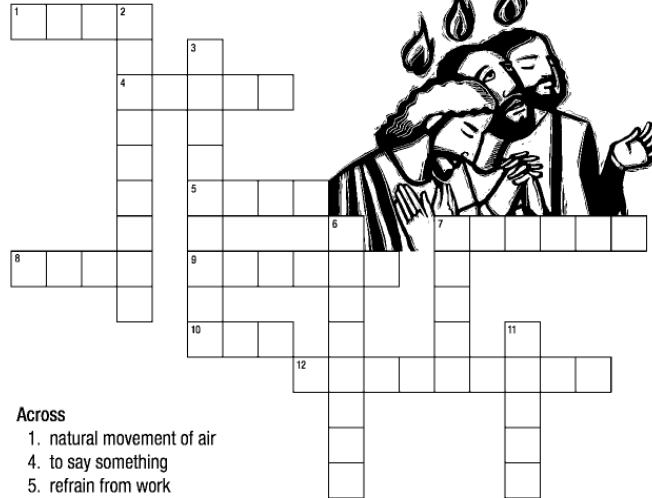
1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.

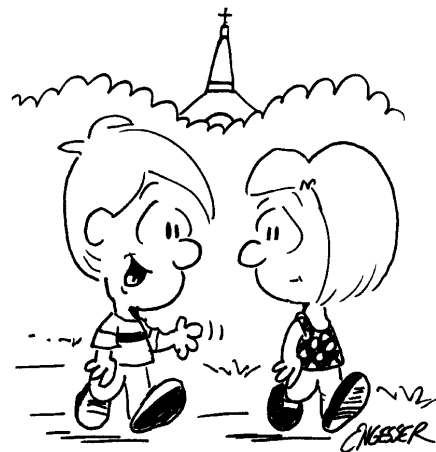
