### FR. JIM'S JOURNAL: "Transitions"

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

When our parish worship committee and I plan the options for our Sunday services by liturgical season, we oftentimes encounter "transition days," that is, days that carry some of the options of the past season, but start us into the new season. For example, two Sundays ago was Trinity Sunday, the Sunday after Pentecost. Since the Day of Pentecost officially closes the Easter Season, we should have gone into the options for the Season after Pentecost; however, in many ways, there were enough "Easter hangovers" to include most of the options we used during the Easter Season for that Sunday. For instance, on Trinity Sunday we continued using Prayers of the People, Form I, along with Eucharistic Prayer "A" and most of the service music options that were used during the Easter Season. However, we added the "Confession of Sin" (which was omitted during the Easter Season) and dropped the "Alleluia's" from the dismissal. This past Sunday, which unofficially began the "Season after Pentecost," we included more "Pentecost Season, Part I (summer)" options, such as a different set of "Prayers of the People" (Form VI) and Great Thanksgiving, Form C.

You might be interested in knowing that there are other "transition days" that occur throughout the Church Year: "Christ the King" Sunday, which is the last Sunday after Pentecost and the Sunday before the Advent Season; The Epiphany (Jan. 6<sup>th</sup>), which concludes the Christmas Season and begins the Season of Epiphany; "Transfiguration Sunday," which is the Last Sunday After Epiphany and the Sunday before Lent, and the Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday, which occurs during Lent but initiates Holy Week.

The reason I'm mentioning "transition days" is that we here at Christ Church are going through some "transition times":

- Due to family obligations, our parish secretary, Michelle Coley, has submitted her resignation. We will truly miss Michelle, but wish her well in her future endeavors. We thank God for the fine work she has done for our parish, and for her warmth in communicating with parishioners and visitors alike. Due to Michelle's resignation, we will imitative a process for calling a new church secretary.
- Due to much-needed repairs in the church building, we will be having Sunday services in the parish hall, from this Sunday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, through the next few Sundays. We hope to have all the work done by the middle or end of August. (Work to be done includes repairs of some cracks and the painting of walls and parts of the ceiling; refurbishing of the wood floor, and the placement of new carpeting.)

It will be good for us to know that we will still be having our usual two Sunday services at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m., and that we will keep the church office “covered” by volunteers who will staff the church office while we search for a new secretary. The important thing for us to be aware of is the presence of **Jesus Christ**, our Lord and Savior, through our parish’s—and our own personal—“transition times” As it is noted, “Jesus Christ is the same: yesterday, today, and forever.” In Jesus, God’s love for us never changes—and it is always there for us.

Please remember the privilege of us worshipping and honoring our God together, is not confined to the church building alone. We are called by our loving and forgiving God to gather weekly to worship Him as a Body in Christ. The **physical building** where we worship is not as important as **the people** gathered together in Christ’s name to worship in the Spirit. So, please join Deacon Vern, our parish leaders and me, in worshipping our God, **temporarily** in the church hall, but **always** in Christ Jesus.

Have a good, blest and refreshing summer, remembering who we are and WHOSE we are!

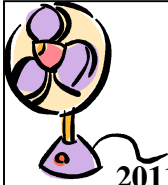

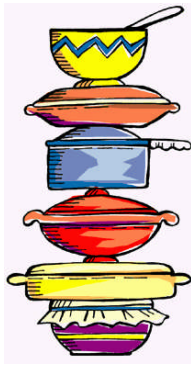


### **NEWS RELEASE** **2011 PROJECT FAN HEAT RELIEF**

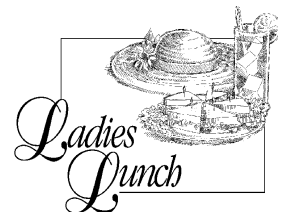

## **AN IMPORTANT UPDATE ON OUR CHURCH REFURBISHING, ETC.!!!!!!**

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

We have three important updates on what's happening here at Christ Church:

1. We have received another generous bequest from the estate of the late **Jane Blood**, which will enable us to purchase a new organ for the church. The current organ, which is over 40 years old, is "on its last legs" and has caused some minor problems these past few months. We've been told that there are no parts available for this organ, should it fall into disrepair. It is hoped that the new electronic organ will be in place by October of this year.
2. With the help of some reserve funds (rectory funds, bequests, etc.), we (through our vestry) are able to purchase the house next door (currently owned by Louis and Peggy Taylor, formerly owned by Mrs. Teeter). Purchasing this property for extra parking and "green space" was something that our church had wanted to do when Mrs. Teeter owned that lot, but unfortunately we weren't able to purchase it at that time.
3. Much of the funding for the refurbishing of our church has come from funds from our **Fair Booth Ministry**. We wish to thank the members of the County Fair Booth Subgroup (part of the Outreach Committee) for recommending to our vestry that part of those funds be used for the refurbishing. We also wish to invite our members and friends to help participate in this vital ministry in the life of our parish.

## PATRIOTIC PARFAIT

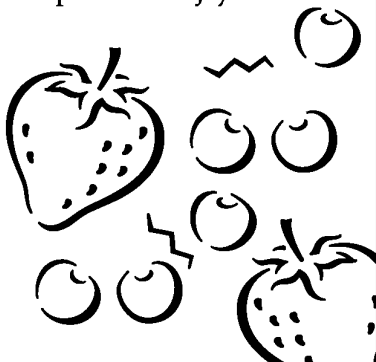
On the 4th of July, make this healthy, festive dessert to share with family and friends.
